Learning Outcomes:	<p>By the end of the event, participants will have had the opportunity to learn about and explore:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The importance of taking this area of work seriously and to understand the impact parents, professionals and others may have on a child suffering from Attachment Disorder. • That these children are not 'bad', they are 'sad', however many are excluded from school and nursery. • That children with attachment difficulties do not respond to a behaviour management approach, in fact this does not work with these children. • An understanding that Reactive Attachment Disorder is a very real illness that lasts throughout life without the correct intervention. • How powerful a consistent, honest, caring relational approaches can enable really positive changes in behaviour. • How attachment problems link strongly to abuse and neglect and should be integral to our assessments regarding significant concerns for a child. • <i>'Every Professional, should be so aware and so 'attachment' practising, because it is the duty of the public body to adapt to the child, not the other way round.'</i> Dr Maggie Atkinson, Children's Commissioner for England • Subsidised training made available through the Early Help Partnership Workforce Development Programme
