<b>Event Description:</b>	<p>The face to face training comprises 3 Modules, each a duration of 3.5 hours which can be booked separately.</p> <p>Modules 2 &amp; 3 explore how to discuss Parental Conflict with Parents, focusing on practicing the skills of handling conversations with parents in conflict, using tools and techniques to enable parents to resolve destructive conflict with positive outcomes. Module 4 is aimed at supervisors and managers only and their approach to supporting practitioners.</p> <p>(Terms and conditions apply, available on website at time of booking.)</p>		
<b>Module 2 Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>By the end of this half-day, skills-based workshop, participants will be able to: -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recognise relationship distress at an early stage and when it is potentially damaging</li> <li>• Support couples experiencing parental conflict and be empowered to act, report or refer should domestic abuse be disclosed/identified</li> <li>• Revisit the cultural and societal influences that can lead to parental conflict</li> <li>• Recognise the role of fathers / male carers in a child's life and understand the importance of including co-parents in all forms of co-parenting couples</li> <li>• Build confidence and skills by using effective listening and questioning techniques to identify and discuss parental conflict triggers</li> <li>• Understand your role and responsibilities in discussing parental conflict with parents, to help the front-line practitioner to normalise the initial conversation, including helping parents to understand the impact of parental conflict on their children</li> </ul>		
<b>Module 3 Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>By the end of this half-day, skills-based workshop, participants will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify the level of conflict encountered and describe the most appropriate support to offer</li> <li>• Respond appropriately when parental conflict is identified</li> <li>• Practice how to approach conversations that may arise around distressed relationships</li> <li>• Know about the available local and national resources available to support parents whose relationship is in conflict</li> <li>• Help parents to engage with these services, by being able to describe what they do and what the evidence shows us about long term outcomes for children</li> <li>• Identify when to talk with your manager about possible domestic abuse and/or child safeguarding situations</li> </ul>		
<b>Module 4 Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>By the end of this half-day, skills-based workshop, participants will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Support members of staff through the handling of parental conflict situations</li> <li>• Recognise the importance of maintaining a focus on reducing parental conflict</li> </ul>		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Apply the evidence-base to day to day interactions with parents</li> <li>• Utilise the tools from the toolkit to support frontline practitioners to work with parents in conflict</li> <li>• Use questioning to probe for further details where necessary</li> <li>• Handle supervisory discussions involving parental conflict cases</li> <li>• Advise staff members on the appropriate course of action appropriate to the situation</li> </ul>
