<i>Event Description:</i>	<p>This course is aimed to develop awareness of the supervisor's role in the child protection process and provides the opportunity to develop skills within the role. Supervision is a vital key to the successful safeguarding and protection of children.</p> <p>This is a two-day course and relevant for all who work in a management or supervisory role within any agency working with children and young people and their families from across Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole.</p> <p>The lack of good supervision is a common theme within many Serious Case Reviews. The need for clearly defined supervision objectives and standards are essential of the child protection framework. It is a very practical course which will enable everyone to reflect and learn from previous experiences with particular emphasis on recognising professional dangerousness. Supervisors should have a greater knowledge of policies, practice standards and procedures that are relevant to our local services .</p> <p>(Terms and conditions apply, available on website at time of booking.)</p>
<i>Learning Outcomes:</i>	<p>By the end of the event, participants will have had the opportunity to learn about and explore:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raise awareness of the guidance, policies, research and legislation that impact on, and form the back-cloth to child protection work. • Provide structured time for reflection, exploration and planning around child protection practices. • Develop the skills and knowledge to enable course participants to recognise dangerous practice through supervision. • Identify the skills required for supervising professionals and how to ensure practices are of a high standard. • Identify the key elements of personal performance and gain practical skills for the supervision setting. • Work on strategies to challenge dangerous practices and to enable supervisors to overcome the barriers within the supervision setting. • Take practices to a higher level in order to safeguard children from risk of harm. • To reinforce the crucial role of good quality supervision in the safeguarding arena.
